Summary of Earth Train's program for Jane Goodall's Roots & Shoots, November 2011

- *The First Latin America/Caribbean Rainforest Leadership Conference For Jane Goodall's Roots & Shoots Youth and Mentors*, a conference for 30 Roots & Shoots leaders from 12 countries to be held at November 6 to 13, 2011, Centro Mamoní at the Mamoní Valley Preserve, Province of Panama.
- *Una Tarde de Biodiversidad Musical*, Sunday, November 13, 2011, a musical presentation in honor of Dr. Jane Goodall produced by Danilo Perez with the Berklee Global Jazz Institute. The program, to be held at the Ateneo, City of Knowledge in Clayton, opens with the debut in the Americas of the feature documentary *Jane's Journey*, narrated by Angelina Jolie.
- *Roots & Shoots In The Rainforest: Jane Goodall sharing stories with emerging young leaders from the Americas* (working title), a 10 to 15 minute documentary to be produced and directed by Pituka Ortega Heilbron for worldwide distribution starting in December 2011.

Executive Summary of the Program

Earth Train and The Jane Goodall Institute (JGI), both U.S. federally tax-exempt educational charities, are collaborating on the development of Jane Goodall's Roots & Shoots programs in the Americas. Jane Goodall's Roots & Shoots, a global environmental and humanitarian youth program of JGI, is a powerful, youth-driven, global network of tens of 16,000 chapters in more than 100 countries. Earth Train, with its international headquarters located in Panama since 2001, is an international youth leadership organization focused on sustainable community development and the protection of biological and cultural diversity. Earth Train founded and manages the 4,000-hectare Mamoní Valley Preserve, located in the eastern Province of Panama.



Earth Train and JGI are engaging the leaders of the Roots & Shoots chapters already in existence in the Americas, particularly those within the Latin America and Caribbean Region (LACRIB), to further develop the youth leadership and community service components of their programs. *The First Latin American/Caribbean Rainforest Conference for Jane Goodall's Roots & Shoots Youth and Mentors* will take place at Earth Train's Centro Mamoní in the Mamoní Valley Preserve from November 6th to 13th, 2011. The gathering and related events, with the participation of Dr. Jane Goodall, program mentors, and distinguished guests, will:

- Lay the foundations of a strengthened regional network of program leaders within Roots & Shoots LACRIB.
- Introduce the participating youth and adult program leaders to the leadership development resources and in field learning opportunities available to them, particularly those now available through the JGI-Earth Train collaboration.
- Result in a plan for the expansion of Roots & Shoots activity in the Americas, to be driven in large measure, by youth-led initiatives and with an emphasis on involving youth from indigenous and rural communities.
- Engage in honest dialogue with Dr. Goodall and guest mentors for a mutually enriching experience that will be documented by the accomplished film maker Pituka Ortega Heilbron assisted by the Grammy-award winning sound engineer/producer Rob Griffin and will be distributed worldwide as an Earth Train/ Roots & Shoots educational resource.
- Introduce opinion makers, educators, and the general public in Panama – and generally in the Americas- to the inspiring work of Jane Goodall and to the opportunities available to young people to take constructive action toward creating sustainable communities and protecting biological and cultural diversity.

The Program

Sunday, 6 November to Friday, November 12:

Conference at Earth Train's Centro Mamoní, in the Mamoní Valley Preserve, located 2.5 hours east of Panama City. Jane Goodall arrives Panama City on Wednesday evening, November 9th and stays at Airport Riande Hotel. Departs early morning, November 10th for Centro Mamoní. November 10th, 11th, and 12th will be spent in dialogue between participants and Jane Goodall and guest mentors. The group departs for Panama City on the morning of Sunday, November 13th.

Sunday, 13 November:

- 9:00 am: Depart Centro Mamoní to Panama City
- 12:00 pm: Lunch and tour at the Biomuseo, Amador, led by Earth Train Co-Executive Director, Lider Sucre.
- 3:00 pm: Jane in dialogue with children involved with ecological restoration at the Metropolitan School of Panama, Ciudad de Saber.
- 4:00 pm Program at the Ateneo, Ciudad de Saber: Showing of the feature documentary *Jane's Journey*, narrated by Angelina Jolie. Presentation by Jane Goodall followed by a **Junglewood** musical production directed by Grammy-award winning jazz musician Danilo Perez with the Berklee Global Jazz Institute.

Junglewood, co-founded in 2008 by Grammy Award-winning jazz musician Danilo Pérez and Earth Train, is dedicated to providing settings and programs rich in biological and cultural diversity and conducive to artistic expression in harmony with nature. Junglewood will eventually have a venue and facilities at the Mamoní Valley Preserve in Panama where musicians, visual artists, educators, and scientists can collaborate on works involving the performing and visual arts, conservation research and education.
